

#### Pacific Profile in NZ


- The majority of Pacific peoples in New Zealand are under 25 years at 55%, compared to 34% of New Zealanders under 25 years.
- Most Pacific peoples live in Auckland 66%.
- Most Pacific peoples are Christians.

# Pacific 0 -19 years Population


**NORTHERN REGION = 72%**

## Faiumu model acronym

F = First engagement

A = Assessment

I = Identify needs, risk and solutions

U = Understand process, protocols, NZ legislations

M = Meaningful engagement

**U** = Unifying the family.
