Key points

- Children who have a parent with mental health and/or addiction issues are at increased risk of a number of poor health and social outcomes. Inequity
- The quality of caregiver relationships in the first three years of life has a critical impact on outcomes 'Gone Dramidrami' strategy at early stage – needs proper trial
- Expanding international evidence refer to COPMIA / Emerging Minds, Werry Workforce
- Pacific Population is an 'invisible population'
