#### **IYP: Early intervention with vulnerable parents: a partnership approach to delivering the Incredible Years Toddler programme**

This presentation discusses the delivery of the IY Toddler programme to parents who have had adverse childhood experiences and are currently supported by Family Start due to a range of problems impacting on their ability to parent positively. The partnership developed with Family Start is critical to tailoring the programme to each parent, their child, and their home. Key things have been learnt about delivering the programme to this cohort of parents, for example, how we mediate vignettes, set up role plays, encourage and manage discussions, and indicators that parents have managed all they can for a given session. Early intervention via the Toddler programme, alongside other wraparound whānau/tamariki supports, may significantly contribute to minimising emotional and behavioural problems in the future. The outcomes of evaluations over seven programmes will be presented.
